Covid-19 and school attendance

Any child with a high temperature (38+ OR feeling HOT to touch), new continuous cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste, regardless of additional symptoms pointing to another cause (including a cold), should self-isolate and be tested.

A new, continuous cough means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).

If you are unsure, you can contact 119 or 111 for advice, you will be asked to describe the symptoms and will then be told if a test is needed.

A child with a normal, mild cold that is well enough to come to school under usual circumstances, should come to school, unless they are exhibiting the above symptoms.
