* Christmas Cards Update *

We have a fabulous parent who has volunteered to do all she can to enable the children to send cards to one another, whilst ensuring our Covid Secure risk assessment is not breached.

As such, there will be some strict conditions that must be adhered to, to make this possible...

1. Each classroom will have its own box, in which cards are placed by the children.
2. Children may ONLY send cards to children IN THEIR OWN GLASS.
3. All cards must be in the box BY the end of the school day on 9th December. If this deadline is missed, cards won't be able to be given out in school.
4. Our amazing volunteer will then collect all the boxes and quarantine them for 72 hours. She will then sort the cards into sets for each child and return them to school.
5. Upon arrival back at school, the cards will be quarantined again for another 72 hours before being handed out to the children on the last day of term.

I know that you will join me in thanking Miss Walbridge for her incredible dedication in undertaking this task.
