Covid-19 Risk Assessment Update

Mrs Fawcett attended a public health briefing for schools this week, in advance of further easing of restrictions from Monday. Although the outside world is beginning to open up, the requirements for schools will not change very much. All the while contact tracing remains in place, schools **must** continue to operate in bubbles, with staggered breaks and drop off / pick up times. As regards the wearing of masks, the advice from the director of public health is that they **should** be worn by parents at the school gate where strict 2m distancing cannot be adhered to. Please be wary of allowing children to mix outside their bubbles when not at school. In the event of positive cases, the spread of the virus in school must be contained to minimise the impact of having to close bubbles and revert to remote learning. Compared with other schools, we have an excellent record, having only had to close one bubble on one occasion during the entire pandemic. This is due to the robust risk assessments and how stringently we are continuing to follow them to keep everyone as safe as possible.

I enjoyed meeting the Bishop today! I also spent some time with some of the children from Year 3 and 4 – I loved seeing the flowers they had made as part of their science topic! Have a lovely weekend everyone!
