J9 Initiative



The J9 Domestic Abuse Initiative is named in memory of Janine Mundy, who was killed by her estranged husband while he was on Police bail. The initiative was started by her family and the local police in Cambourne, Cornwall, where she lived, and aims to raise awareness of domestic abuse and assist victims to seek the help they so desperately need. Mrs Fawcett has undertaken the J9 training and is therefore able to display this logo on her lanyard and in her office window. This means that anyone can talk to her about domestic abuse, can access information and support from her and can disclose domestic abuse if they are experiencing it themselves, or are concerned about someone they think is. These little hearts are displayed in windows anywhere where people have received this training – and designate a safe place for people to access help and information about domestic abuse.

National Leader of Education Visit

Mrs Fawcett welcomed Rev Moore to school again this week and she wrote up a report after her visit. We are delighted to share a quote from it here:
