Reading Meeting



Learning to read in our Reception class

Step 1: Read to me

These can be books from school or home.



Bookmark inside book and book place in box to change the book.



Step 2: Floppy Phonics

Introduce letter sounds- two per week. Online log ins have been given out so you can access and practise at home.

Phoneme sheets- reading practise everyday if possible. Phonics folder taken to/ from school each day.

Step 3: Sharing the reading

Colour banded books- often starting with a book with no words. This is where you start sharing the reading process and encourage your child to take the lead. They tell the story from the pictures. You start asking questions e.g. about the story and the characters or what do you think might happen at the end? Extend vocab e.g. anorak.



Step 4:
Sets of helpful words will be sent out when your child had remembered the first sets of phonemes. Helpful words are to be memorised and often can't be sounded out using the phonemes and patterns we learn in Reception e.g. **I, the, go.**



Step 5: Your child reads to you stage

Your child will bring home a reading book with words that they can read. The book is for them to read to you and build up the speed with which they read the words, begin to recognise words from previous books and have time to discuss what is happening on each page of the book.
